| Developed by the NC Healthy Start Foundation's ITS-SIDS Project, this session meets state requirements for ITS-SIDS training. Participants will learn to reduce the risk of SIDS through safe sleep practices for infants. Participants will also review Safe Sleep Policy guidelines, NC Division of Child Development licensing rules, and maintenance of the proper forms. SIDS-related materials and resources will be available. <i>Stanly County providers only. (1.5 hours) \$5</i> | | | |
| August 28th | Basic School-Age Care (BSAC) & School-Age Care Environmental Rating Scale (SACERS) | 9:00 am-4:30 pm | SCPC |
| Instructor: Desmond Miller, School-Age Specialist with Child Care Resources, Inc. | | | |
| The state of North Carolina mandates BSAC training for all school-age professionals who work in or operate a licensed child care program. The modules in BSAC will cover the elements of quality care, child development, positive guidance, age appropriate activities, environmental design, health/safety, nutrition, and NC Child Care Regulations. The second training session of the day will be SACERS (School Age Care Environment Rating Scale). This training provides a wealth of information through visual presentations, handouts, practice scoring scenarios, helpful hints, and common low scoring items. Designed specifically to stimulate group discussion and participation, workshop attendees at all levels will explore common elements that create high quality learning environments for school age children/youth and be able to use those and apply them in their own programs. ALL afterschool programs can use this information to self-assess their programs and implement strategies to build environments that work for children and staff. Programs working toward increasing quality or higher star licensure should definitely attend. <i>Please bring a bag lunch. (7 hours) \$10</i> | | | |
| August 31st | Head Lice and Poison Control | 6:30 pm-8:30 pm | SCPC |

| A Nurse Child Care Health Consultant will present this class to day care providers to teach them how to recognize Lice and Nits, how Lice spread, treatment, prevention, control methods, and policies that are needed in Day Care Centers regarding children or staff with Head Lice. Also this training will provide child care providers an overview of Poison Control, identifying poisons in the home and in child care centers, surrounding environments, risk factors, and will describe ways to prevent poisonings with children from birth to five years of age. It will identify First Aid for poisonings and correct procedures to follow when calling the Poison Control Center. <i>Stanly County providers only. (2.0 hours) \$5</i> | | | |
| September 9th | Increasing Quality With the ITERS-R | 6:30 pm-8:30 pm | SCPC |

| This session provides an overview of the ITERS-R and the expectations in the areas of interactions, supervision, health and safety, room arrangement, materials, and more. Includes a video that teaches participants how to score the indicators of the scale, and how to improve from minimal to good to excellent quality. Participants who own a copy of the ITERS-R book are encouraged to bring it to the training for reference. | This training is provided as an overview of inclusion, generally presented as a first module in a 4 part series. The objective is to provide the participant with a basis of the history of support for school age children with disabilities (medical model vs. empowerment model), and with a philosophy of inclusion. | Do you know what makes a playground safe? This session is designed to promote safe play areas for children in child care. Participants will learn about potential hazards on the playground and gain hands-on experience by completing a playground safety check. <i>Enrollment limited to one director and one staff member per child care program. - September 16th** **Causes of Misbehavior:
Why Do They Act This Way?** **6:30 pm-8:30 pm** **SCPC**

Why do some children come to depend on challenging behaviors while others discover better, more effective ways to get what they want? Generally, children use negative behavior when they lack the skills that would help them meet their needs. Teachers who take time to assess the reason for misbehavior are better able to teach children new social-emotional skills. This session focuses on the common reasons that children misbehave, a crucial first step in determining how to prevent/reduce challenging behaviors. **(2.0 hours) \$5**
- September 21st** **Recognizing Children

A Child Care Nurse Health Consultant will present information on normal vision and hearing development and factors that place a child at risk for problems. Want parents to understand the value of block play? This training session will identify different types of play and the valuable learning experiences gained from block play. - October 5th** **Math in the Preschool Classroom:

Having an understanding of the math skills that children are learning during their play and exploration will help us see play in a different way. Children use many different kinds of behavior as they grow and test their skills. Some of these behaviors, although appropriate for their developmental age, are still very challenging for teachers. This session focuses on understanding when children can be expected to acquire certain social-emotional skills and guides participants toward understanding, respecting and responding to developmentally appropriate behaviors. **(2.0 hours) \$5**
