This training will provide child care providers an overview of Sudden Infant Death Syndrome, identifies SIDS risk factors and describes ways to reduce the risk of SIDS in child care. Child Care Providers will become familiar with the new “Back to Sleep” law that applies to child care providers and know how to develop and maintain a Safe Sleep policy. **(2.0 hours) \$5 Stanly County providers only.**

September 13th	Behavioral Intervention Strategies: You Want Me to Try What?	6:30 -8:30 pm	SCPC

Teachers who care for children with behavioral difficulties, often find themselves reacting in ways that reinforce the behavior and make it worse. Behavioral intervention strategies are planned responses to behaviors that help teachers prepare for situations in which past

responses have not been successful. This session focuses on helping participants develop new responses to challenging behaviors using six key intervention strategies. **(2.0 hours) \$5**

October 4th **Go Green/Poison Control** **6:30 -8:30 pm** **SCPC**

Instructor: Joy Heglar, BSN /CCHNC with the Stanly County Health Department

This class will teach participants the advantages of using all natural products for cleaning versus chemical choices. The Child Care Health Consultant(CCHC) will also discuss how chemicals trigger asthma and discuss ways that the provider can play an active role in making our environment safe and healthy for our children. In the second half of the training, the CCHC will provide child care providers with an overview of Poison Control: identifying poisons in the home, child care center, and the surrounding environment; risk factors; and ways to prevent poisoning with children ages birth to five years. The training will also identify first aid for poisonings and the correct procedure to follow when calling the poison control center. The similar appearance of medicine compared with candy (medicine chest to pass around) and demonstrating several options for locking cabinets will also be discussed. **(2.0 hours) \$5* Stanly County providers only.**

October 11th **Boys Will Be Boys:
So Why Do We Teach Them Like Girls?** **6:30 -8:30 pm** **SCPC**

Struggling with ways to help the boys in your classroom stay focused while still keeping the girls engaged? Come learn the differences in boys' and girls' play, rough and tumble play verses aggression, and strategies to help the boys in your class be successful. **(2.0 hours) \$5**

The Child Care Health Consultant will teach the child care providers the definition of Methicillin-Resistant Staphylococcus Aureus (MRSA), what to observe for and how to prevent MRSA, how to prevent the spread of MRSA, who is at risk and finally, treatment of MRSA. They will also learn the importance of sanitation rules and education for families in preventing the spread of MRSA. **(2.0 hours) \$5 * Stanly County providers only.**

October 20th **Creating Outdoor Learning
Environments for Infants and Toddlers** **6:30 -8:30 pm** **SCPC**

This training will help participants understand the benefits of taking children outside daily. It will give suggestions on how to create spaces for infants and toddlers outside that support all areas of learning and introduce them to the natural environment. Finally, participants will be given ideas on what activities can be included in their outdoor space. **(2.0 hours) \$5**
