Spring 2012 Workshops/Stanly County Partnership For Children

February 23rd & ITS-SIDS* 6:30-8:30 pm
May 22nd

Instructor: Joy Heglar, BSN /CCHNC with the Stanly County Health Department

This training will provide child care providers an overview of Sudden Infant Death Syndrome, identifies SIDS risk factors and describes ways to reduce the risk of SIDS in child care. Child Care Providers will become familiar with the new “Back to Sleep” law that applies to child care and develop and maintain a Safe Sleep policy. **(2.0 hours) \$5*Stanly providers**

March 21st Emergency Preparedness* 1:00-5:30 pm

This class offers participants the knowledge, skills, and resources needed to instruct children, staff, and families in the event of an emergency and provides strategies for improving the safety of children during emergency situations. Providers will come familiar with the goals of the Emergency Quick Guide for Child Care Programs. Providers will also learn to identify the following areas of planning, preparing, practicing, responding and recovering and use these to develop a policy and plan to utilize during emergency situations. Participants will receive 4.5 hours of credit and may obtain an additional 4.5 hours of credit for successfully completing an emergency plan for review. **(4.5 hours) \$5* Stanly providers**

April 17th Understanding and Managing 6:30-8:30 pm
Asthma in Child Care*

This curriculum was developed by the American lung Association to be used with the child care providers. The class defines what asthma is, the management of asthma symptoms, asthma medications and triggers of asthma in the environment. Policies and a plan for managing asthma in the child care center and resources and tools will also be discussed. **(2.0 hours) * Stanly Providers**

April 19th PCAN: Understanding and Responding 6:30-8:30 pm
to Abuse and Neglect of Infants & Toddlers*

Infants and toddlers are disproportionately affected by abuse and neglect, and abuse and neglect can have lifelong consequences. In recognition of Prevent Child Abuse Month, early childhood professionals will have an opportunity to define child abuse and neglect, learn the prevalence of abuse/neglect in the infant-toddler population, and examine the impact of maltreatment on a young child's development. Participants will have an opportunity to strategize how best to respond to suspected abuse /neglect and how to discuss these issues with parents. **(2.0 hours) \$5 *Stanly providers**

June 26th Recognizing Children with Special Needs* 6:30 pm-8:30 pm

Teachers will be trained on the “red flags” they need to look for in the children in their center/homes. This training is important for the beginning of the referral process which includes parents, local agencies and the school system. Early intervention is the key to success for children with special needs and different developmental stages will be discussed. January 17th & 31st **Managing Challenging Behavior:
The Power of Positive Relationships (.5 CEU class)** **6:30 pm-9:00 pm**

The Pyramid Model developed by the Center on the Social and Emotional Foundations for Early Learning (CSEFEL) provides a framework for preschool teachers to support the social-emotional development of young children. In this module, you will explore attitudes about challenging behaviors among other aspects to reduce these behaviors and focus on a positive relationship which is crucial to the foundation of a child's ability to learn. You must attend both classes to receive credit. **HSB Class \$25 (.5 CEU credit)**

March 20th **How Are You? How Am I?
Fostering Emotional Literacy (2.0 hours)** **6:30-8:30 pm**

Most preschool teachers introduce their students to a large variety of literature and pre-literacy activities. However, emotional literacy- (the ability to identify, understand and respond to emotions in you and others in a healthy manner) is even more basic to school readiness. Come learn the tools to use in your daily curriculum to make teaching of emotions fun and easy. **\$15.00 HSB Class**
